


The Business School – Self-guided Tour Sheet

Begin in Building:One Reception, on the ground floor.

Building:One was completed in February 2011 as part of a £24 million investment programme and holds world-class facilities for research, teaching, learning and social interaction.



1 Ahead of you is the Student Services Desk and Information Point.

The Student and Education Services Team support undergraduate and postgraduate students. They are the first port of call for our students handling both academic and pastoral enquiries. Office hours are 8.15am to 5pm, Monday to Friday.

2 On your right is Building:One's café, La Touche.


Open from 8am to 5pm in term-time and shorter hours in the holidays, La Touche is a popular

meeting place for students and serves a range of hot and cold food and drinks.

3 On the far side of the café, you will find two student discussion rooms.

These are sound-proof rooms, which can be booked at Reception. There are 4 student discussion rooms in the Business School in total; the other 2 can be found in the corridor connecting Xfi to Building:One (we will see these later in the tour).

4 Walk back towards Reception and take the lift/stairs on your left up to the second floor. (We will see the first floor later in the tour).



5 Arriving on the second floor, you will see the offices of the Partnerships Team on your left.


The Partnerships Team handles the external relations of the Business School, including corporate partnerships and alumni relations.

6 Continue through to the corridor on your right. Here you will find several teaching rooms.

These teaching rooms will be used for students' seminars and tutorials throughout a degree. The

rooms are fitted with projectors and equipment for student presentations.

7 Continue to the end of the corridor and take the stairs down to the first floor, alternatively you can return to the lift.



Building: One First Floor

8 On the first floor you will find yourself above La Touche. The balcony space is a breakout area for students.

9 Leading onto the balcony are the Matrix and Bateman lecture theatres.


These lecture theatres were funded by donations from alumni and are modelled on the lecture theatres at Harvard. These smaller theatres are fitted with state of the art technology and can

seat 60 people each. Smaller Business School modules are taught in these lecture theatres.

10 At the end of the balcony towards the lift you will see the MBA suite.

This space is for our post graduate MBA students. This suite contains its own study and research library. On the left of the door is a list of our corporate partners who make this post-graduate degree possible.

Take the stairs or lift back down to the ground floor. Return to reception and go through the double doors on the left of the reception desk. This takes you to the link corridor which leads to the Xfi building.




11 In the corridor, on the right, you will see the two additional student discussion rooms.

They are soundproofed and contain equipment allowing students to practise presentations and undertake group work.

12 Continue to the end of the corridor and you will find yourself in the XFI Building with the Henderson lecture theatre on your right.

This is the second largest lecture theatre in the Business School, newly refurbished to now seat 180. Note the dual projectors and monitors at the back; many undergraduate lectures are recorded and available later on the student web portal.



13 Follow the blue line on the carpet down the Xfi corridor. On either side are more teaching rooms, where tutorials and seminars are held.

14 As you emerge from the corridor a student computer room is on your left.

15 Next on the left is the Thomson Reuters Finance Lab


This room is used by postgraduate finance students. Here they can access finance databases including Bloomberg, MorningStar and Datastream. This room may also be used for some undergraduate finance modules and the student finance and trading societies. We have plans to extend this suite.

16 On your right is XFI's Study Space.

This informal study space provides a relaxed environment for our students and is a popular meeting place for staff and students alike.

17 All around you on the ground and first floor are the offices of our Finance academics.

If you now continue past the café and exit through the door into the carpark you will see the Streatham Court building in front of you. Cross the carpark and walk right, towards the road. Enter Streatham Court through the final door on your left, close to the bike rack, which is covered with a glass porch.




18 You are now in the Careers Zone.

The Careers Team supports our Industrial Experience programmes and offers one to one careers support for all students. They work with leading employers and run a huge range of employability events in the School throughout the year.

19 Passing through the doors opposite the Career Zone you will find yourself in the corridor by our main lecture theatres.

On your right, you have three lecture theatres: Streatham Court Lecture Theatres B, C and D. Lecture Theatre B has around 90 seats, while C and D can seat around 120 each. Some Business School modules may be held here.



20 At the end of the corridor is Streatham Court Lecture Theatre A.

Lecture Theatre A is the largest Lecture Theatre of the Business School. This holds about 270 people and is fully equipped with monitors and projectors. Many undergraduate lectures are recorded and available later on the student portal.

Business School students will have many of their lectures in Streatham Court but they will also have teaching in other buildings on campus.

Now go through the automatic doors on your left which take you outside. Passing the courtyard, enter through the doors ahead. Use the silver pressure plates to the right to open the doors here.

21 Here you will find the Academic Offices.

Academic staff for Economics, Accounting, Management, and Organisational Studies are all based here. All lecturers and tutors have 2 hours per week when their doors are open for students to drop in and ask any questions. Students are also welcome to make appointments with their lecturer or tutor outside of this time. We

encourage students to take advantage of this contact time to access one-on-one support.

22 Take the first left in this corridor and go through two sets of double doors to find the FEELE Computer Lab.

This is the Finance and Economics Experimental Laboratory at Exeter, set up using funding from the University, the ESRC and the British Academy. It enables our students and academics to conduct simulation experiments in finance and economics.

23 Continue to the end of the corridor, where the International Development team is based.

The International Development Team supports students on our study abroad programmes and international Summer Schools, as well as managing international partnerships.

Exit through the double doors ahead and you will be back in the car park area. If you have any further questions please return to Reception. We do hope you have enjoyed your visit to the Business School.
